Despite this exuberance, the country is still polarized over immigration. Many believe that immigrants are the cause of the country's growing problems, including the rise in crime rates, overcrowding, rising health costs, to name a few.

Thus, immigration remained a highly divisive issue in 2006. Fortunately, with the mid-term elections resulting in the rejection of candidates who campaigned on a platform opposing immigrants, there is cause for hope that the new Congress may enact comprehensive immigration reform (CIR) in 2007. Those who believe in CIR have a more positive and hopeful message. It is axiomatic that a positive message will carry the day over the negative messages – laced with hate and xenophobia – from the anti-immigrant groups and organizations. CIR will fix a broken immigration system, provide more legal pathways for immigrants to work and unite with families, and treat immigrants and their families more fairly and humanely.

CIR recognizes that immigrants fill in the much needed gaps within the US labor market and America can be even better if it is able to harness the industry, ambitions and dreams of those who are drawn to it. Such a positive approach is preferable over a policy that will lead to mass deportations of millions of people and treat them as criminal felons, which is what the House attempted to

do in late 2005 through H.R. 4437. Fortunately, H.R. 4437 never took effect in 2006.
